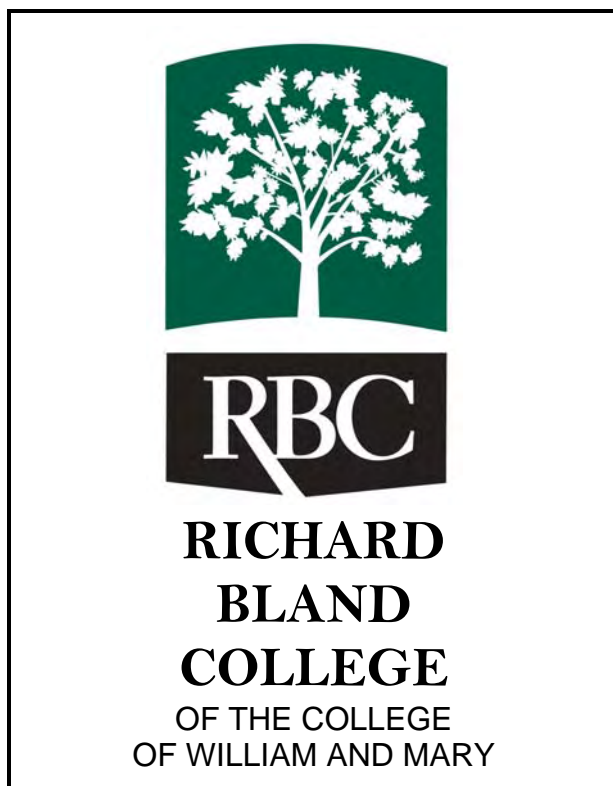

MISSION

Richard Bland College of The College of William and Mary in Virginia was founded in 1960. It is the Junior College of the Commonwealth of Virginia. REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

STEP 1 ADVISING Make sure you are meeting degree requirements to ensure your timely graduation by scheduling an appointment with your advisor *as soon as possible* to plan your fall 2009 class schedule. *Print your Unofficial RBC Transcript and your Degree Evaluation for reference during your advising session. Go to Banner Web/Student Records to obtain these documents.* After your advising session, your advisor will give you a completed and signed *Recommended Course Form*, User ID Number, and "Alternate PIN" for fall 2009 to assist you when you register via Banner Web (www.rbc.edu). *You must see your assigned advisor to get your Alternate PIN.*
Note: Student web registration/class changes ends at 4 p.m. on August 25.

STEP 2 REGISTRATION Enter the Banner Web Registration through the College's website (www.rbc.edu). Directions are posted at the registration stations and on the computer screens and on the last page of this bulletin.

STEP 3 PRINT A COPY OF YOUR SCHEDULE Be sure *all* your courses are listed on the printout.

STEP 4 TUITION If you pre-register on/before August 6 tuition is due **August 7 by 4:00 p.m.** Mailed tuition must be postmarked no later than **August 4** to ensure timely arrival in the College's Cashier's office. If the full tuition is not paid or if financial aid procedures are not completed by **August 7, your courses will be dropped.** Then, you may re-register beginning **August 12, and pay your tuition by 4 p.m. on the day of registration.** Your *original* course sections are not guaranteed and may not be available.

Beginning August 12, 2009 tuition payment is due by 4:00 p.m. on the day of registration. Register first and then pay tuition at the Cashier's Office in Maze Hall.

FINANCIAL AID RECIPIENTS: Your signed award letter must be on file in the Financial Aid Office to receive credit for financial assistance.

LATE REGISTRATION (August 19-25) Follow STEPS 1 - 3 above. Pay your tuition at the Business Office in Maze Hall by 4:00 p.m. on the day of registration. Beginning **August 20** a \$25 Late Fee will be charged.

CLASS CHANGES. Class changes may be made during the registration period that ends at 4:00 p.m. on August 25. If necessary, go to your advisor for assistance with class changes.

CLASS AUDITS OR REPEATS. All forms are available at the Registrar's Office in Maze Hall and the RBC website (www.rbc.edu) on the Registrar page. Appropriate forms must be submitted with signatures to the Registrar's Office. Applications for **Audit-to-Credit** status must be submitted by August 25. Applications for **Credit-to-Audit** status must be submitted by the penalty drop date (October 30). Applications to **Repeat** courses must be submitted by August 25.

CLASS DROPS (August 26 - October 30) Beginning August 26 *web* registration and class changes are no longer available to students. To drop a class the student must complete a Class Drop form and submit it to the Registrar's Office in Maze Hall. Class Drop forms are available at the Registrar's Office in Maze Hall and on the Registrar's link of the RBC web site (www.rbc.edu). **Last day to drop a class without academic penalty is Friday, October 30.**

TAXPAYER RELIEF ACT OF 1997

The taxpayer Relief Act of 1997 requires that all higher education institutions issue a Form 1098-T for students. This form provides to the Internal Revenue Service the name, address and social security number of the student and certifies enrollment status of half-time (six credit hours) or greater. The Form 1098-T will be used to determine taxpayer eligibility for the appropriate tax deduction. For more information, see IRS Publication 970 or contact your tax consultant.

REFUND POLICY

Dropped Courses: Students who drop courses shall be entitled to a refund of a portion of tuition paid for the semester in which they are currently enrolled as outlined below. Students who remain on full-time status (at least 12 credits) are not entitled to a refund.

NOTE: No refund for a change from full-time to part-time status (less than 12 credits) occurring after August 25, 2009.

Withdrawal from College (Dropping All Courses): Official withdrawal from college must be in writing to avoid receiving failing grades for courses. Students withdrawing from the College must complete the Official Withdrawal Form, available from the Registrar’s Office (804-862-6185) or by letter (with signature) stating the reason for withdrawal. All student accounts with the College must be settled before the Registrar’s Office can process a withdrawal. A student wishing to return to the College must complete a Readmission Application available at the Center for Student Affairs and on the Admissions link of the RBC website (www.rbc.edu). Students who withdraw in good standing shall be entitled to a refund of a portion of tuition paid for the semester in which they are currently enrolled as outlined below:

CERTIFICATION OF GOOD STANDING STATUS

Students attending Richard Bland College for the first time must have an *official* high school transcript, showing date of graduation, diploma type, and GPA forwarded directly from the high school to the Richard Bland College Center for Student Affairs. Students who have earned the G.E.D must provide a copy of the document, showing scores *and* have the *official* transcript forwarded from the high school. Newly enrolled or readmitted students who attended other colleges must have *official* transcripts forwarded from all other colleges attended. Until these credentials are received by Richard Bland College no credit may be awarded for courses in which students are enrolled. Responsibility for having credentials forwarded to Richard Bland College rests solely with the student.

Financial aid purchases can be made from August 12–September 1. **The last day to return items on financial aid is September 1.** A picture I.D. is required for all financial aid purchases. Full refunds are given for books with receipt through **August 26**, if book is not marked or damaged in any way. Books purchased after **August 26** can be sold back for current buy-back value. All book purchases that do not fall under these options can be sold back at current buy-back value. **Full refund or full exchange value cannot be given for shrink-wrapped books that have been opened.** If books were purchased with a credit card, refunds are credited back to the card. That credit card and receipt must be presented at the time of refund. Payment options: cash, checks (exact amount of purchase only), and credit cards (VISA, DISCOVER, MASTERCARD, AMERICAN EXPRESS).

PARKING ON CAMPUS

Parking decals must be on vehicles within two weeks after classes begin, otherwise parking tickets will be issued.

Residential Students (**red** decal) may park in the Residence Hall Parking lot only. Residential Students may not park in the Commuter Parking Lots on campus. For security purposes, all vehicles parked on campus must display a current RBC parking decal. The vehicle registration card will be required in order to be issued a parking decal. Tickets will be issued for vehicles not displaying parking decals. Commuter students (**gold** decal) may park only in the two large lots on each side of Johnson Road. Student vehicles parked in lots or spaces reserved for Faculty and Staff and those vehicles without parking decals are subject to ticketing and a \$30 fine that increases to \$40 if not paid in 14 days. Repeat violators will be wheel-locked. *Temporary parking permits for documented medical reasons may be obtained from the Business Office.*

Accessing Student Records & Registration via RBC Banner Web

Log on to www.rbc.edu

Click on “Access Banner Web” in the right column, then on the Access Banner Web bar in the middle of the page.

If you get a “page cannot be displayed” message, it may be because the computer you are using could be blocking access to the site. You should try a computer from a public access area (such as a public library, etc.), where such blocks are not enforced. You may also try the following:

1. From “Internet Explorer” enter the following: <https://faith.rbc.edu:769/>
2. From the RBC Homepage click on the Information Technology Services link and look for “Banner Web”

Click on "Enter Secure Area"

Enter your User ID (R00-----) *or* SS# and your PIN. If this is the first time you are accessing RBC Banner Web, your PIN is your “six-digit” date of birth (MMDDYY). You will be prompted to change your PIN to a “*new*” 6-digit number. Continue to use the *new number* to enter Banner.

Click on “Login”. Initially, you will be prompted to ask yourself a question & then answer it. Keep this simple. If you use hyphens or slashes in the answer that is how you must enter it later. If you need to use this option you must enter your User ID (or SS#) first. Then, select the Forgot Pin button.

At the MAIN MENU select one of the following options.

Personal Information

Update addresses, contact information or marital status, review name or social security number, change information, and change PIN.

Student Services & Financial Aid

Access the RBC on-line registration system, student records. Financial Aid information is not available on Banner Web.

Select from lists behind these links to access additional information.

To “register” or “make course changes” for an upcoming semester you must have your *Alternate PIN only available from “your” advisor each semester*. Your Alternate PIN expires at the end of the first week of classes and cannot be used for an upcoming semester. Registration for summer must be done through the Registrar’s Office; therefore, no Alternate PIN is needed.
