

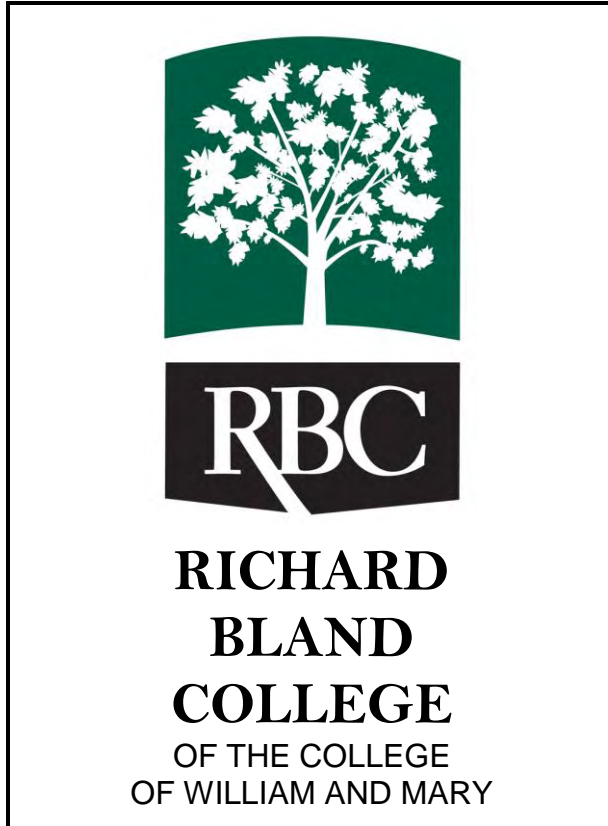

MISSION

Richard Bland College of The College of William and Mary in Virginia was founded in 1960. It is the Junior College of the Commonwealth of Virginia. The College offers a traditional curriculum in the liberal arts and sciences leading to the associate degree, and other programs appropriate to a junior college. The curriculum is intended to allow students to acquire junior status after transferring to a four-year college, or to pursue expanded career opportunities. The College also recognizes its responsibility to serve the public by providing educational and cultural opportunities for the community at large.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

STEP 1 ADVISING Make sure you are meeting degree requirements to ensure your timely graduation by scheduling an appointment with your advisor *as soon as possible* to plan your Spring 2012 class schedule. **Print your Unofficial RBC Transcript and your Degree Evaluation for reference during your advising session.** Go to **Banner Web/Student Records to obtain these documents**. After your advising session, your advisor will give you a completed and signed *Recommended Course Form*, User ID Number, and "Alternate PIN" for Spring 2012 to assist you when you register via Banner Web (www.rbc.edu). **You must see your assigned advisor to get your Alternate PIN.**
Note: Student web registration/class changes ends at 4 p.m. on January 20, 2012.

STEP 2 REGISTRATION Enter the Banner Web Registration through the College's website (www.rbc.edu). Directions are posted at the registration stations and on the computer screens and on the last page of this bulletin.

STEP 3 PRINT A COPY OF YOUR SCHEDULE Be sure *all* your courses are listed on the printout.

STEP 4 TUITION **If you pre-register on/before December 13**, tuition is due **December 14 by 4:00 p.m.** Richard Bland College offers a variety of options to pay tuition, fees, and housing costs. Payments can be made by mail or in person. The College accepts online payments using an electronic check or credit card (Visa, MasterCard, and Discover). The College also offers a Payment Plan for part-time and full-time students with a balance of \$1,000.00 or more. Mailed tuition payments must be postmarked no later than **December 8** to ensure timely arrival in the Office of Student Accounts. If you have questions regarding payment options, please contact the Office of Student Accounts at (804) 862-6213 or (804) 862-6248. Additional information regarding payment options is available on the Student Accounts page on the RBC website at <http://www.rbc.edu/paymentoptions.php>.

If the full tuition is not paid or if financial aid procedures are not completed by **December 14**, **your courses will be dropped**. Then, you may re-register beginning **January 3**, and pay your tuition by 4 p.m. on the day of registration. When you re-register, your *original* course sections are not guaranteed and may not be available.

FINANCIAL AID RECIPIENTS: Your signed award letter must be on file in the Financial Aid Office to receive credit for financial assistance.

LATE REGISTRATION (January 16 - 20) Follow STEPS 1 - 3 above. Pay your tuition at the Office of Student Accounts in Maze Hall by 4:00 p.m. on the day of registration. Beginning **January 17** a \$25 Late Fee will be charged.

CLASS CHANGES. Class changes may be made during the registration period that ends at 4:00 p.m. on **January 20**. If necessary, contact your advisor for assistance with class changes.

CLASS AUDITS OR REPEATS. All forms are available at the Registrar's Office in Maze Hall and the RBC website (www.rbc.edu) on the Registrar page. Appropriate forms must be submitted with signatures to the Registrar's Office. Applications for **Audit-to-Credit** status must be submitted by January 20. Applications for **Credit-to-Audit** status must be submitted by the penalty drop date (April 6). Applications to **Repeat** courses for a *second attempt* must be submitted to the Provost by January 20.

CLASS DROPS (January 23 - April 6) Beginning January 23 *web* registration and class changes are no longer available to students. To drop a class the student must complete a Class Drop form, obtain applicable signatures, and submit it to the Registrar's Office in Maze Hall. Class Drop forms are available at the Registrar's Office in Maze Hall and on the Registrar's link of the RBC web site (www.rbc.edu). **Last day to drop a class without academic penalty is Friday, April 6.**

TAXPAYER RELIEF ACT OF 1997

The taxpayer Relief Act of 1997 requires that all higher education institutions issue a Form 1098-T for students. This form provides to the Internal Revenue Service the name, address and social security number of the student and certifies enrollment status of half-time (six credit hours) or greater. The Form 1098-T will be used to determine taxpayer eligibility for the appropriate tax deduction. For more information, see IRS Publication 970 or contact your tax consultant.

REFUND POLICY

Dropped Courses: Students who drop courses shall be entitled to a refund of a portion of tuition paid for the semester in which they are currently enrolled as outlined below. Students who remain on full-time status (at least 12 credits) are not entitled to a refund.

NOTE: No refund for a change from full-time to part-time status (less than 12 credits) occurring **after January 20, 2012.**

WITHDRAWAL FROM COLLEGE (Dropping All Courses): Official withdrawal from college must be in writing to avoid receiving failing grades for courses. Students withdrawing from the College must complete the Official Withdrawal Form, obtaining applicable signatures and submit it to the Registrar's Office. The form is available at the Registrar's Office or on the Records and Registration link of the college website - <http://www.rbc.edu/PDFS/WithdrawalfromCollege.pdf> . All student accounts with the College must be settled before the Registrar's Office can process a withdrawal. A student wishing to return to the College must complete a Readmission Application available at the Center for Student Affairs and on the Admissions link of the RBC website (www.rbc.edu). Students who withdraw in good standing shall be entitled to a refund of a portion of tuition paid for the semester in which they are currently enrolled as outlined below:

CERTIFICATION OF GOOD STANDING STATUS

Students attending Richard Bland College for the first time must have an *official* high school transcript, showing date of graduation, diploma type, and GPA forwarded directly from the high school to the Richard Bland College Office of Admissions. All students must complete and return the Student Disciplinary History form and the Dean's or Counselor's Certification form prior to the admissions staff reviewing their application. (High School students must have their guidance counselor complete the Counselor's Certification form; if you are transferring to Richard Bland College from another institution, you must have the Dean of Students (or equivalent administrator) complete the Dean's Certification form. If you are not currently attending any institution, high school or college, please have the appropriate staff member from the last institution you attended complete the form on your behalf. You may mail the Student Disciplinary History form, but the Counselor's or Dean's Certification form must be submitted via fax or mail by the counselor or appropriate Dean. Students who have earned the G.E.D. must provide a copy of the document, showing scores *and* have the *official* transcript forwarded from the high school. Newly enrolled or readmitted students who attended other colleges must have *official* transcripts forwarded from all other colleges attended. Until these credentials are received by Richard Bland College no credit may be awarded for courses in which students are enrolled. Responsibility for having credentials forwarded to Richard Bland College rests solely with the student.

RECEIPTS ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL REFUNDS/RETURNS

Financial aid purchases can be made from January 4-27. **The last day to return items on financial aid is January 27.** A picture I.D. is required for all financial aid purchases. Full refunds are given for books with receipt through **January 27**, if book is not marked or damaged in any way. Books purchased after January 27 can be sold back for current buy-back value. All book purchases that do not fall under these options can be sold back at current buy-back value. **Full refund or full exchange value cannot be given for shrink-wrapped books that have been opened.** If books were purchased with a credit card, refunds are credited back to the card. That credit card and receipt must be presented at the time of refund. Payment options: cash, checks (exact amount of purchase only), and credit cards (VISA, DISCOVER, MASTERCARD, AMERICAN EXPRESS). We also have some titles available for rental.

PARKING ON CAMPUS

Parking decals are issued by the Police Department after students pay tuition and show vehicle registration. For security purposes, all vehicles parked on campus must display a current RBC parking decal. **The decal must be on the vehicle within two weeks after classes begin, otherwise parking tickets will be issued.** Tickets will be issued for vehicles not displaying parking decals and for improper parking. **Residential Students** may park only in the Residence Hall Parking lot. **Residential Students may not** park in the Commuter Parking Lots on campus. **Commuter Students** may park only in the two large lots on each side of Johnson Road. Student vehicles parked in lots or spaces reserved for Faculty and Staff and those vehicles without parking decals are subject to ticketing and a \$30 fine that increases to \$40 if not paid in 10 days. Repeat violators will be wheel-locked. *Temporary parking permits for documented medical reasons may be obtained from the Police Department.*

RBC 101 (Academic Planning) – FULL-TIME, FIRST-TIME, DEGREE SEEKING STUDENTS only.

Enrollment in a section of RBC 101 is required for all full-time, first-time, degree seeking students and is only available to those students. This course cannot be dropped or audited, unless the student drops to part-time status. The course cannot be repeated. **First time “TRANSFER” students MAY NOT take RBC 101.**

Full-time refers to students enrolled in 12 or more credit hours (including RBC 101).

Students registered for RBC 101 and drop to part-time status during the class change period (ending January 21) must also drop RBC 101. (See Bookstore about book refunds.)

First-time refers to students who are currently enrolled in their first semester at RBC and upon admission to the College have not been enrolled in any college course after graduating from High School.

Degree-seeking refers to students who have indicated they plan to complete the requirements for an Associate degree at Richard Bland College.

During the initial advising session, students will choose the section of RBC 101 according to the instructor’s expertise and the student’s academic and career goals. That instructor will also serve as the student’s academic advisor. Attendance for the three scheduled classes is **mandatory (January 17, February 7, and February 28)** and completion of the course requirements (outlined in the syllabus) is required. The course will satisfy one elective credit and the grade *will* affect the student’s term and cumulative grade point averages.

Click on “Login”. Initially, you will be prompted to ask yourself a question & then answer it. Keep this simple. If you use hyphens or slashes in the answer, that is how you must enter it later. If you need to use this option to reset your Pin, you must enter your Banner User ID (or SS#) first. Then, select the “Forgot Pin” button.
