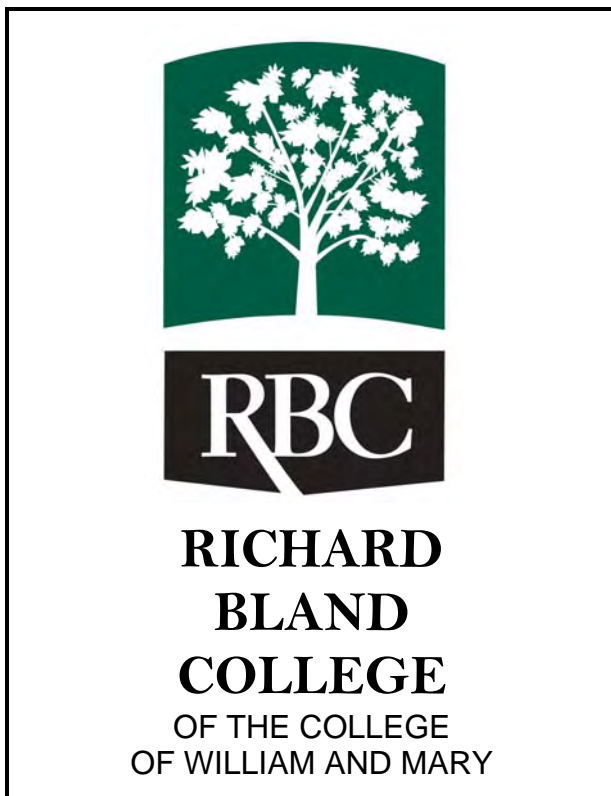

SUMMER AT RBC

The purpose of the summer session is to provide opportunities for College students and other adults to further their educational programs during the summer and to enable high school graduates to begin college work prior to the fall semester.

Richard Bland College offers a variety of courses during the months between the end of the spring semester and the beginning of the fall semester. A three-week session is offered in May. Two day sessions of four weeks each and an evening session of eight weeks also are offered.

There are numerous course offerings available during the day and evening for students who desire to accelerate their program or to make up academic deficiencies. A student may enroll in up to fifteen credit hours during the summer.

All students seeking summer enrollment must meet the same academic standards for admission as outlined in the "Admission Requirements" section of the college catalog. **Enrollment in a summer session does not imply admission to the college.** To be considered for regular admission, a student must complete the application process through the Center for Student Affairs. Call 804-862-6225 for information.

Specialized courses designed for teacher re-certification are regularly offered. Teachers may enroll in these courses and earn up to three credits for each course. These courses are restricted to public or private school teachers or may be selected with the permission of the instructor.

GENERAL INFORMATION

SUMMER ADMISSION: *(Students who are enrolled spring 2010 are not required to complete the Summer Registration Form).* New, Transfer, and Readmitted students must complete the Non-Degree/Summer Registration Form *and* the Application for Virginia In-State Tuition Rates (second and third pages of Registration Form). The forms are available at the Registrar's Office in Maze Hall and on the Registrar's link of the College website (<http://www.rbc.edu/registrarforms.html>). Submit the forms to the Registrar's Office or mail them to Office of the Registrar, Richard Bland College, 11301 Johnson Road, Petersburg, VA 23805-7100. *Enrollment in the Summer Session does not imply admission to the college.* For information regarding admission for fall and spring semesters contact the Center for Student Affairs. Call 804-862-6225, or visit the Richard Bland College web site (www.rbc.edu).

REGISTRATION: Visit the Registrar's Office in Maze Hall to register for summer classes. (Banner web registration is not available for summer classes). Tuition is due at the time of registration. Information concerning tuition is located on page four of this bulletin.

TUITION: PAYMENT OF TUITION IS REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION.

The Cashier's Office accepts cash, checks, money orders, and credit cards (MC or VISA). *For faster service and student convenience we recommend that students include a check or money order with the Non-Degree Registration Form.* Students who do not complete the Application for Virginia In-State Tuition Rates will be classified out-of-state for tuition purposes.

With the approval of the proper authorities, the College also reserves the right to make changes at any time regarding tuition and other fees.

TAXPAYER RELIEF ACT OF 1997: The Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997 requires that all higher education institutions issue a Form 1098-T for students for all tax years beginning January 1, 1998, and later. This form must report to the Internal Revenue Service the name, address, and social security number of the student and certify enrollment status of half-time (six credit hours) or greater. The Form 1098-T will be used to determine taxpayer eligibility for the appropriate tax deduction. For more information, see IRS Publication 970 or contact your tax consultant.

REFUND POLICY: Students withdrawing from a summer term prior to the beginning of class will be entitled to a full refund less a \$25 processing fee. Students withdrawing in good standing shall be entitled to a refund of a portion of tuition paid for the summer term in which they are currently enrolled as outlined below:

* Students withdrawing from one-week courses will be eligible for 80% refund after first class and 60% refund after second class, with no further refunds after the end of the second class day.

SUMMER LODGING: Summer students may stay overnight on the RBC Campus while attending classes. The Richard Bland College residence halls are fully equipped apartment units of one-to-four bedrooms, including full baths, living room, laundry, and kitchen (with microwave, range, refrigerator, and dishwasher). Each unit is furnished and wired for television and computers. Individuals are responsible for all laundry items including bedding, pillows, and towels, as well as all kitchen utensils (pots and pans, silverware, dishes, etc.). Rates are \$220.00 per week (Sunday – Saturday) and \$44 per extra night, payable at the time of registration for summer classes.

Accessing Student Records & Registration via RBC Banner Web

Log on to www.rbc.edu

Click on “Access Banner Web” in the right column, then on the Access Banner Web bar in the middle of the page.

If you get a “page cannot be displayed” message, it may be because the computer you are using could be blocking access to the site. You should try a computer from a public access area (such as a public library, etc.), where such blocks are not enforced. You may also try the following:

1. From “Internet Explorer” enter the following: <https://faith.rbc.edu:769/>
2. From the RBC Homepage click on the Information Technology Services link and look for “Banner Web”

Click on "Enter Secure Area"

Enter your User ID (R00-----) *or* SS# and your PIN. If this is the first time you are accessing RBC Banner Web, your PIN is your “six-digit” date of birth (MMDDYY). You will be prompted to change your PIN to a “*new*” **6-digit number**. Continue to use the *new number* to enter Banner.

Click on “Login”. Initially, you will be prompted to ask yourself a question & then answer it. Keep this simple. If you use hyphens or slashes in the answer that is how you must enter it later. If you need to use this option, you must enter your Banner User ID (or SS#) first. Then, select the “Forgot Pin” button.

At the MAIN MENU select one of the following options.

Personal Information

Update addresses, contact information or marital status, review name or social security number, change information, and change PIN.

Student Services & Financial Aid

Access the RBC on-line registration system, student records. Financial Aid information is not available on Banner Web.

Select from lists behind these links to access additional information.

To “register” or “make course changes” for an upcoming semester you must have your *Alternate PIN only available from “your” advisor each semester*. Your Alternate PIN expires at the end of the first week of classes and cannot be used for an upcoming semester. Registration for summer must be done through the Registrar’s Office; therefore, no Alternate PIN is needed.
