

TRANSFER AGREEMENT
THE COLLEGE OF WILLIAM AND MARY
AND
RICHARD BLAND COLLEGE
of The College of William and Mary

WHEREAS, Richard Bland College has been a branch The College of William and Mary since its inception in 1960; and

WHEREAS, since the early 1960s William and Mary has been accepting transfer students from Richard Bland College who have earned a cumulative grade point average of 3.00, exclusive of physical education, who have been recommended by criteria set forth by the Office of the Provost; and

WHEREAS, both William and Mary and Richard Bland College are governed by the Board of Visitors of The College of William and Mary;

NOW AND THEREFORE, Richard Bland College and The College of William and Mary agree as follows:

1. That The College of William and Mary, effective with students entering Richard Bland College in the 2011 Fall Semester, will guarantee acceptance to all Richard Bland College graduates who have completed an Associate in Arts Degree (A.A.) or an Associate in Science Degree (A.S.) at Richard Bland College and have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.25 exclusive of physical education, at the time the degree is awarded, and who have been recommended by Richard Bland College. If courses are repeated, the original and repeated course grades will be included in the calculation of the cumulative grade point average.

Students who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents and whose native language is not English are required to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). The Committee on Admission looks for the following scores:

- 100 and above – Internet-based TOEFL
- 250 and above – Computer-based TOEFL
- 600 and above – Paper-based TOEFL

Forty-five (45) of the sixty-three (63) required credit hours needed to earn the Associate Degree must be earned in residence at Richard Bland College. Eligibility for admission under the terms of this agreement is contingent upon meeting high standards of personal conduct. Conviction of a felony or other evidence of behavior inconsistent with the community

standards and Honor Code of W & M may be grounds for denying admission or rescinding an offer of admission.

Admission to W & M under the terms of this agreement does not imply admission to degree programs in the School of Business Administration or the School of Education. Students intending to enroll in these programs are encouraged to discuss prerequisites and other requirements well in advance of admission.

2. That the faculties of the two institutions will work together to maintain a course-by-course evaluation of all courses listed in the Richard Bland College Catalog, and that Richard Bland College faculty and advising staff will encourage prospective William and Mary transfer students to meet the spirit of William and Mary's general education requirements to the greatest extent possible, including enrollment in foreign language course work at Richard Bland College.

This Statement of Agreement will be reviewed every three years by both institutions.

This Statement of Agreement will remain in effect until terminated by either party upon written notice to the other party of an intention to terminate. Such notice shall be effective only if given 180 days prior to the intended date termination.
