- Asynchronous online by Richard Bland College instructors

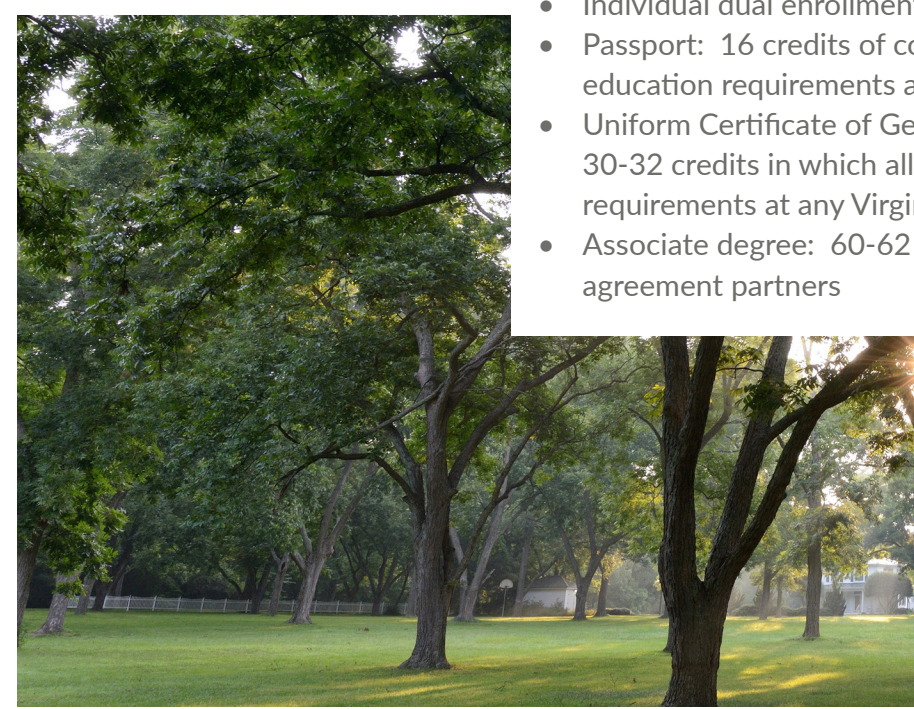
Asynchronous vs. Synchronous learning

Asynchronous learning - allows you to learn on your own schedule, within a certain timeframe. You can access and complete lectures, readings, homework, and other learning materials at any time.

Synchronous learning - attend class virtually each week with instructors and classmates, participate in real-time discussions during class time.

Dual Enrollment Pathways

- Individual dual enrollment courses
- Passport: 16 credits of coursework which are transferable and satisfy lower-division general education requirements at any Virginia public institution of higher education
- Uniform Certificate of General Studies (UCGS): a one-year college program consisting of 30-32 credits in which all courses are transferable and satisfy lower-division general education requirements at any Virginia public institution of higher education
- Associate degree: 60-62 credits of coursework which are transferable to one of our 35+ transfer agreement partners
