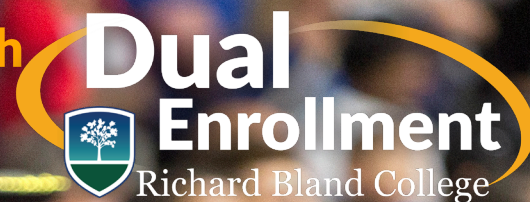

Obtain permission from parent/guardian and your high school. Homeschool students must submit a copy of the current homeschool agreement /letter from local school board.

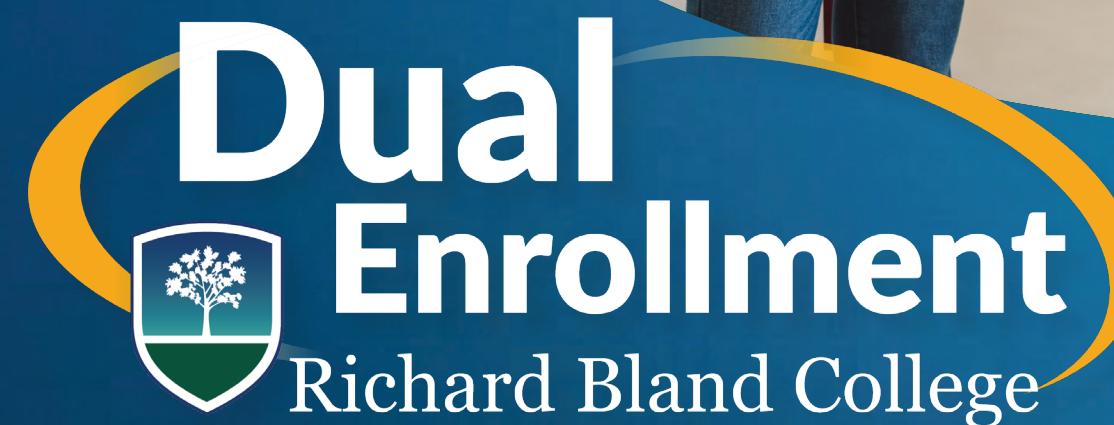
Complete the online dual enrollment application once permission has been granted by your high school.

Dual Enrollment offers college level courses to high school juniors, seniors, and homeschool students that fulfill both high school and college graduation requirements.

- Asynchronous online by Richard Bland College instructors

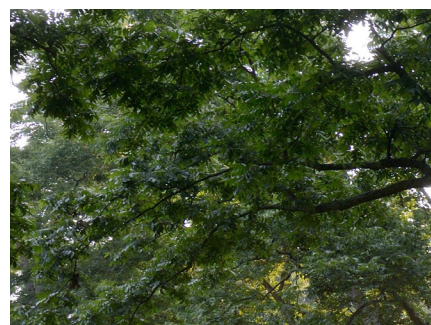
Asynchronous vs. Synchronous Learning

Asynchronous learning- allows you to learn on your own schedule, within a certain timeframe. You can access and complete lectures, readings, homework, and other learning materials at any time.

Synchronous learning - attend class virtually each week with instructors and classmates, participate in real-time discussions during class time.

DUAL ENROLLMENT PATHWAYS

- Individual dual enrollment courses
- Passport: 16 credits of coursework which are transferable and satisfy lower-division general education requirements at any Virginia public institution of higher education
- Uniform Certificate of General Studies (UCGS): a one-year college program consisting of 30-32 credits in which all courses are transferable and satisfy lower-division general education requirements at any Virginia public institution of higher education
- Associate degree: 60-62 credits of coursework which are transferable to one of our 35+ transfer agreement partners
